Fairlington League of Women Voters Conducts Membership Drive

A Punch Party on Wednesday evening, April 10th, in the Assembly Room of the Administration Building from 8:00-10:30 p.m. will climax a membership drive of the Fairlington League of Women Voters.

This organization which has grown with Fairlington, was organized in May, 1944. Six people were present at that original meeting. Mrs. Harold Stone, Mrs. George Allen, Mrs. Charles Muir, Mrs. C. P. Banks, Mrs. Adrian DeWind and Mrs. Chester Jones. This was the beginning of the Arlington-Alexandria League of Women, which later expanded to include 9 other neighborhood groups.

Mrs. Allen was the first chairman of the Fairlington unit which started its activity in the fall of 1945 by a series of discussions on Dumbarton Oakes. The membership rose and fell with the degree of turnover in the population of Fairlington but the activity continued, discussions on Dumbarton Oaks and Bretton Woods, letters to Congressmen, the San Francisco Conference, campaign for Price Control which was climaxed by a booth in the Shirlington Super-Market where interested persons could send post cards to their Congressmen. Over 300 people participated in this project.

In May, 1945, an evening League Group was organized in Fairlington with Mrs. Claudia Zavslosky chairman, and this group collaborated with the afternoon group on continued action on Price Control, and the distribution in Fairlington of broadsides urging the School Electoral Board to set up qualifications for its candidates and requesting them to interview the candidates for membership on the Arlington County School Board.

Now that Fairlington is settling down the League Group is also becoming more stable under the direction of its present chairman, Mrs. Lester Nurick. All women in Fairlington interested in following the program of the League of Women Voters on topics of local, national and international interest are invited to the Punch Party on April 10th. Parrainage Program

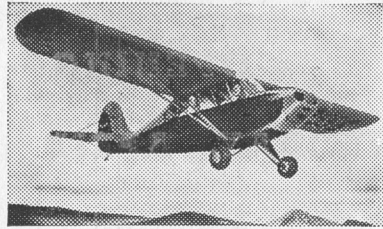
Names of needy children for "adoption" may be secured from the Social Services of the Resistance in France, according to Mrs. George Finney, who has represented the FRANCE FOREVER Committee here in Fairlington and has been active in collecting clothing for the French people.

Under the adoption plan, donors promise to send his "Filleul" at least two parcels of food and clothing per month over a period of 12 months. These parcels can be supplemented by school supplies and various comforts and donors will be guided in their selections by needs evidenced in the letters received from the child. Correspondence with these children will do much to strengthen the ties between our two countries.

Packages may contain such items as rice, cocoa, chocolate, powdered whole milk, sugar and sweets. Fats are desperately needed. Maximum weight of packages is 11 pounds; 42 inches in length, combined length and girth 72 inches. Smaller packages may be sent.

Comforts, tooth brushes, paste, thread, needles, shoe polish, etc., may be added. *Be careful to buy unscented soap.*

In leaving Alexandria therefore you can only pick up the bus on King Street between West Street and Pitt Street.

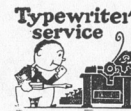
